Prevention



Families who choose to participate in Community Prevention (CP) partner with a Family Coach to identify needs which may include, but are not limited to:

- Finding resources for basic needs including housing, utilities, food and transportation.
- Parenting skills & managing children's behavior challenges.
- Life skills including job search
- Budgeting and money management.
- Child care and education resources.
- Adult education and GED resources.
- Finding new connections in the community.
- Building a family support system personalized to family needs and individual situations.

Who can we serve?

- Single and two parent families WITH children 18 and younger living with them
- Parents/caregivers can be legal guardians (or not) to the childre
- Probation cases if determined there is a need beyond what Probation can provide for the individual
- Pregnant or parenting youth/young adults
- Young adults without children (ages 19-25)
